Write down your ideas and talk about them with your family or friends.





The Artistic Processes

Recall the image you looked at earlier as you explore the artistic processes through the questions and activities below.



Respond - Explore and Understand

- What **symbols** and **objects** do you notice?
- How does the artist use shape and line to demonstrate movement?

<u>Connect - Relate to the Art</u>

- What do the objects on the tile tell you about the culture of the Qajar Dynasty?
- Why do you think this tile was created? What function or purpose did it serve?

<u>Create - Make Art</u>

- Choreograph a dance and/or compose a song highlighting aspects of your culture and heritage.
- Create your own **costume** to accompany your dance and/or song. Wear it while you perform.

Present and Perform-Share Your Art

- **Share** your creations with your family or friends.
- Take a moment to tell them what you **discovered**.
